The rest of the band has progressed to plain hunt on seven with help from the ringers at Chalgrove and Benson. Some are now ringing the treble to plain bob and grandsire triples and others to doubles. We are now busy working out how to develop ropesight across multiple ringers all at the same time, all ringing together.

We also took part in the tower twinning for the first time and had a successful trip to Dorchester and welcomed them back at Watlington a week later. This was a good first experience for our band having all rung at Dorchester previously, either at the ringing school or while our bells were away. We thoroughly enjoyed the Dorchester cake!

Our simulator is up and running and is proving to be really useful in giving a ringer "a perfect band" to ring with. We now have it on a big screen and are experimenting with whether it can help us develop ropesight as well as rhythm and listening skills.
